# **Guide to Online Voice Lessons**

## 1) Arrange a time and "place"

Agree on a time with your voice teacher. Decide a video-chat streaming service that works for you. Some examples of this include Skype, Facetime, Zoom, etc.

### 2) Be Ready!

Be 'online' and ready a few minutes before your voice lesson so you can start on time. Your teacher will video-call you when it is your lesson time.

#### 3) Location, location, location...

Set up your lesson in a space where you feel comfortable singing, stretching, and exploring your voice! Choose a room where your lesson will not be interrupted by family, pets, or other distractions.

### 4) Come prepared

Check that you have all your materials readily available before your lesson.
